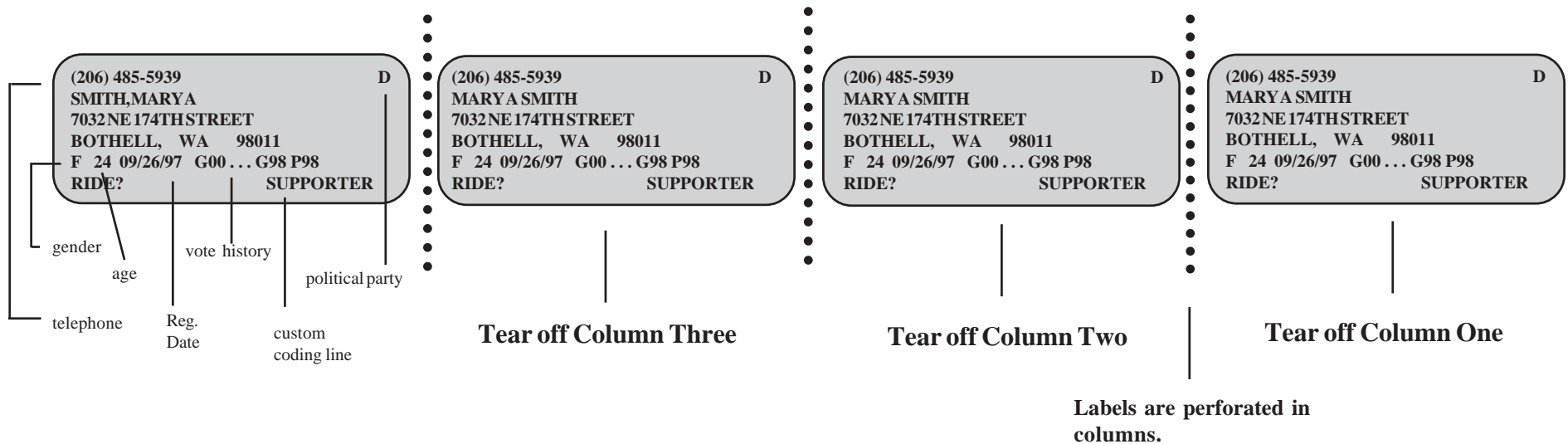


# 4-Across Poll Watching Labels



## Step One.

Select the voters you want to reach. This label provides their phone number, age, gender, party, registration date and voting history. The records are sorted alphabetically by last name and then first name within precinct and four labels are generated for each voter. At the beginning of each precinct a row of four labels will identify that precinct along with the county, CD, SD and HD.

## Step Two.

Labels are sorted by alphabetically by precinct and the first row presents the last name first. This allows you quickly to find a particular voter within the precinct. After he or she has voted, draw a heavy line through all four labels for that voter.

## Step Three.

To provide your central office with a list of supporters who have not yet voted, just tear off the right most column of labels. The first label in the column will identify the precinct. Those without a line through them have not voted and can be contacted. Repeat the process later in the day with column number two and then column number three. The volunteers at the polling place will retain column four as the master list.
